Police Sniper 1 – Action Ready

“To Fire a Perfect Shot”

This course teaches all the fundamental skills required for basic police sniper operations, focusing on the mental and technical skills required to fire a perfect shot under ideal conditions. It is the foundation level on which all the others are built. If you can take only one sniper course before you are expected to perform on operations, this is the one. If you have taken other sniper courses, take this one to “actually learn to shoot” and to learn to do it consistently and accurately to the MilCun standard. Subjects include:

- Familiarization with longer ranges (150, 200, 300 meters)

- For PS1, there are no other prerequisites.

Course tests:

- Written Knowledge Confirmation
- Cold Clean Barrel (CCB) & Group
- Four 5-shot groups on 1 MOA aiming mark at 100 meters

Standard: 80%

Ammo: 400 rounds

Course length: 5 days (0800 to 1700); approximately 50% classroom, 50% range work
